

LETTER FROM THOMAS W. SMITH AND ADAM ANDRZEJEWSKI

The federal debt has exploded by five times over the past two decades, and is now approaching \$30 trillion, with no end in sight. Today our elected officials are dreaming up new schemes to spend taxpayers' hard-earned income. The twin problems of spending and debt will never be addressed by elected officials or bureaucrats. After all, they benefit from the spending. The job has to begin with taxpayers and voters. That's where we come in.

Our goal at OpenTheBooks is to educate the voting public about how their tax dollars are spent. We believe transparency will be transformational in how our country is governed. Once voters know how their money is being spent, they will begin to ask questions that never occurred to them before.

The printing press was instrumental in bringing about the Protestant reformation and the nation state. The copying machine helped to bring down the Soviet empire in central Europe. The spinning machine sparked the industrial revolution. Mark Mills in his new book, *The Cloud Revolution*, points out that we are on the cusp of a technological revolution the equivalent to the Industrial Revolution. Like the printing press revolution, nothing, including government, is immune.

The Economist stated that Big Data would change social science like the microscope changed medicine. Big Data, the Cloud Revolution, the IT world can do for government what the microscope did for medicine. It will shine a light on government for everyone to see.

OpenTheBooks has the technology to bring the expenditures of every one of the 139,000 government agencies online, real time to every cell phone, iPad, and computer. This will enable everyone - every voter and every taxpayer - access to every governmental expenditure at every level: local, state, and federal. Voters can now review government checkbooks, just as they monitor their own.

Last year, OpentheBooks filed 47,000 Freedom of Information Act requests. We captured \$12 trillion in government spending, 49 of 50 state checkbooks, 25 million public employee salaries, lists of government contracts and grants, pensions, and some personal records.

Our mobile app will be publicly available at the end of the first quarter in Apple stores and Google Play stores. This will allow access to 613 million individual vendor payments, 20 million public employee salaries, and 5 million individual pensions from an estimated 50,000 government entities. We are updating our files monthly with new information.

Later this year, we expect to have our e-commerce site up and running which will allow for the easy export of government expenditures. In essence, we will be making our large database much more user-friendly. It will feel Amazon-like with a cart and a checkout counter. It will be available 24 hours a day, 7 days a week, at the fingertips of academics, political leaders, would-be politicians, the media, and especially tax-paying voters.

Each of those 47,000 Freedom of Information Act requests have to be followed up on. Naturally, we run into resistance from politicians and heads of agencies who wish to keep their budgets and expenditures from the public. We understand: some of this information may be embarrassing to them. Once they know we are watching, they may take greater care of the resources provided to them.

For instance, the Vice President has refused to give us any information on how her office spends your tax dollars. The Federal Reserve gave us only 369 names out of 23,000 employees. (Why does the Federal Reserve need 23,000 employees?) The U.S. Postal Service (now, this is hard to believe) refused to give us any of their operating expenses because it is, we are told, a "trade secret." It is equally hard to imagine Federal Express or UPS waiting to get their hands on the U.S. Postal Service's money-losing "trade secrets." The desire for secrecy is nonpartisan. Republicans in the House of Representatives held a secret vote on earmarks. Republicans! A secret vote! Meanwhile, the red state of South Dakota only allows a request for one public employee salary at a time.

We had to sue Wyoming for their state checkbook. We won. We are suing California for their line-by-line state checkbook. We expect a judgement soon. We are working with two public interest law firms, The Cause for Action Institute and the Judicial Watch to represent us in court.

Last year was a brand-building year. Our focus was to make our reports more timely so that voters and interested journalists can react to them in real time. We worked weekends to bring this about. In 2021, we published over 298 oversight reports versus 43 the year before. Our goal next year is to launch 500 investigations. Our media attention has exploded, growing from 3,000 citations in 2020 to over 7,000 citations in 2021. We expect to continue this momentum into 2022.

In 2021, the BBC, *The Wall Street Journal, USA Today,* CNBC, "American Greed," *The Washington Post, The Chicago Tribune,* CSPAN, and many more featured our investigations. Eleven shows on Fox News showcased our findings, including "The Tucker Carlson Show," "Hannity," "The Laura Ingraham Show," "Outnumbered with Emily Compagno," and "Primetime with Jesse Watters."

Fifty-four investigations were published in *Forbes*. The Sinclair Broadcast Group syndicated our "Waste of the Day" column published at RealClearPolitics. Sinclair also aired our "Waste of the Week" interview each Friday from The National Desk on their 190 ABC, NBC, CBS, and Fox local stations.

Information-at-fingertips 24 hours a day is embedded in our culture today. Our focus is to expand that culture to government. Our technology makes it possible, for example, for anyone attending a school board meeting or town council meeting to have every expense of that school district and town on their cell phone. And by year end, it will be dramatically more user-friendly.

Eventually, our elected officials, our bureaucrats will come to understand there is no place to hide. When that happens, it will be transformational. Irresponsible spending will be dramatically reduced. Annual deficits will be substantially reduced or eliminated. Our government will become far more efficient, less bloated, and more attentive to taxpayers. It is hard to imagine anything more powerful to the preservation of our country, of our democracy than bringing to light every government expense.

We appreciate all of the help you have given us. Our goal is to be the equivalent of an Amazon when it comes to allowing the public access to every tax dollar spent.



Rather than 43 investigations (2020), we published 298 oversight investigations. We filed 47,000 Freedom of Information Act (FOIA) requests - the most in American history - up from 40,000 requests last year. We received 7,000+ media mentions and citations, which was more than in the previous two years combined!

We believe transparency revolutionizes U.S. public policy and politics.

Our mission changes the culture with the power of the Freedom of Information Act, the latest technologies, and forensic auditing techniques. We do this hard work, so you can follow the money - even in your school district, township, country, or municipality.

We closed out the year with an open letter in The Wall Street Journal outlining the cost of the Build Back Better bill. National Review cited our ad as one of the key reasons that the bill failed in the U.S. Senate.

In 2021, national media that featured our investigations included the BBC, Wall Street Journal, USA Today, CNBC's American Greed, The Washington Post, Chicago Tribune, C-SPAN, Drudge Report, and many more. Our 54 investigations at Forbes racked up 6 million views and shined a white-hot spotlight on waste, fraud, corruption, and taxpayer abuse.

Our "Waste of the Day" column published at Real Clear Policy was syndicated by the Sinclair Broadcast Group (a Fortune 500 company)—owners of 190 ABC, NBC, CBS, and FOX local stations across America.

- Our auditors mapped the \$350 billion bailout to the 50 states, 600 tribes, 7 territories, and 30,000 localities across America. Created an interactive map so citizens can review their local "congressional bailouts."
- Published at Forbes (617,135 views), we discovered a new perk for federal employees: paid \$1,400 for up to 15 weeks to stay home if their kids aren't enrolled in a fulltime school. Cost? \$570 million.
- Partnered with USA Today (circ: 1.2 million) and shared our findings of the wasteful spending in the bill. We helped influence the frame and findings of the piece, "Is Biden's \$1.9T Covid-19 Relief Package Too Much?"
- Fox News covered our findings. 180 ABC, NBC, and CBS stations owned by Sinclair Broadcast Group aired three national segments. We had two hours on CSPAN's Washington Journal program to outline the waste. Newsmax aired two interviews including on their national morning show and Sunday "Save The Nation" program.

- Launched our findings at Forbes (257,147 views) and The Wall Street Journal (2.8 million subscribers) that Los Angeles County lifeguards are paid up to \$392,000 per year in total compensation.
- We found 82 lifeguards made more than \$200,000 and seven lifeguards made between \$300,000 and \$392,000 in 2019, the latest year available.
- Driving taxpayer costs higher was the overtime payouts and public-sector union membership. We found that a single lifeguard earned \$630,000 in overtime alone during a five-year period!
- Made national and international news including two pieces in The Wall Street Journal, Drudge Report, Fox Business, Daily Mail, New York Post, and iHeart Radio's 'Deep Dive' podcast.

- Our auditors spent a collective 125 hours in one day to compile from 324 Member of Congress websites - 3,309 earmarks costing taxpayers \$9.3 billion. Republicans earmarked \$4.7 billion and Democrats \$4.6 billion
- In the initial snapshot (May 2021), 6 of the top 7 Members proposing earmarks were Republicans and 14 out of the top 25.
- 23 Republican freshmen received \$370 million in Pelosi's approved earmarks. These freshmen tipped the Republican House embrace of earmarks.
- Created an interactive map of the earmarks by congressional district across USA.
- Five television networks aired our findings including FOX News; the 170 ABC, NBC, and CBS stations of Sinclair Broadcast Group - two segments including an interview with Jan Jeffcoat; One America News Network (OANN) interview with Stephanie Myers; NewsMax, Wake Up America interview; and Epoch TV.
- Other groups providing coverage included Real Clear Politics, Yahoo! News, Newt's World 360, ZeroHedge, Epoch News, and Jim Bohannon's national radio show.
- Key issue: Our Honorary Chairman In Memoriam U.S. Senator Tom Coburn successfully fought to ban earmarks. The ban lasted for over a decade.

- We found that only Democratic Mayors defunded their police and spent millions of taxpayer dollars using the police on their own police security. Our entire study published at Forbes.



- **U.S. foreign aid** dwarfed federal payments to 48 out of 50 state governments only California and New York received more. Launched our findings at Sinclair Broadcast Group on The National Desk morning show and in our Forbes policy column.
- Afghanistan was the #1 recipient of U.S. foreign aid at \$6 billion per year and exceeded all other 170 countries. The Afghan security forces also received \$83 billion over a 20-year period in military equipment and training.
- The Taliban overran Afghanistan and captured the U.S. provided war chest: 75,000 military vehicles; 200 airplanes and helicopters; 600,000 weapons, and much more. The Taliban is classified under U.S. law as a terrorist organization. Forbes: Our investigations quantifying U.S. military gear left behind received over 660,000 views.

- Then, we published our findings at **Forbes** (365,198 views) and topped the **Drudge Report** for 44-hours. We showed how the Occupational Safety and Health Administration (OSHA), a regulatory agency, was tasked with enforcing the Biden vax mandate using draconian fines a tenfold increase in fines hidden inside the \$3.5T reconciliation act being considered by the U.S. House.

- When U.S. Attorney General Merrick Garland sic'ed the FBI on parents who stood up at local school board meetings, we turned a white-hot spotlight on his son-in-law's K-12 survey company.
- We published our findings at Forbes and found that Panorama has a large footprint in K-12 education with contracts in 50+ of the nation's 100 largest school districts. The company describes its business as supporting "13 million students in 23,000 schools and 1,500 districts across 50 states."
- Searching our proprietary database of federal, state, and local expenditures, we found \$27 million in government payments to Panorama. Contracts were lucrative with some consulting charging taxpayers \$250 per hour.
- Our findings included the discovery of \$60 million in venture capital raised from Mark Zuckerberg, Priscilla Chan, and Steve Jobs' widow Lauren Powell Jobs. We likened Panorama's surveys to "the gateway drug for Critical Race Theory."
- Our broadcast launch on The National Desk at Sinclair Broadcast Group aired on 190 local ABC, NBC, CBS, and FOX stations across America. Our findings were also aired at Fox News on the major primetime programs: Ingraham Angle, Hannity!, and The Tucker Carlson Show.
- Major media covering our findings included the New York Post, National Review, Fox Business, Zero Hedge, The Wilkow Majority on Sirius XM, The Charlie Kirk radio show, and Snirdley's WABC radio program in New York City.


